

ARE YOU CONSIDERING BECOMING A COUNTY COUNCILLOR OR PARISH COUNCILLOR ?

In preparation for the upcoming elections in May, Rutland County Council is holding two Candidates and Agents Briefing Sessions for anyone that is considering standing.

Sessions will take place from 6pm – 7pm on Tuesday 28 February at Oakham Museum and from 3pm – 4pm on Monday 13th March in the Council Chamber at Catmose House.

The briefings will give anyone interested in becoming a councillor help and information regarding standing for either a County Council vacancy or a parish council vacancy. It will also cover key dates, qualifications/disqualifications, the submission of nomination papers, agents' roles, postal votes, voter ID, the poll, the count and candidate spending.

Rutland County Council's Election Team will be at hand to help with any enquiries you may have.
