	<p>A member of the public present at the meeting expressed his disappointment that there had been no acknowledgement at the opening of the meeting about the recent passing of a local parishioner.</p> <p>The Chair explained that the Council had not been informed of this and were therefore in no position to make comment.</p> <p>The same member of the public raised concern about the defibrillator in the village by the post box being out of action. 	<p><b>Planning Application 2022/0766/FUL</b></p> <p>Proposal: Proposed single storey porch side extension, new rooflight to the front elevation, dormer and folding sliding doors to the rear.</p> <p>The Barns, Manor Road, Stretton, Rutland LE15 7QZ</p> <p>It was noted that the extension would appear to limit the parking space on the existing driveway, but the Council can see no objection to this.</p> <p>There was unanimous agreement to support the application.</p> <p><i>Action: Clerk to enter response on the RCC Planning Portal.</i></p>
067/22	<b>Post Mounted Litter Bin on Manor Road</b>
	<p>SPC have been contacted by RCC following a recent litter bin audit and noted that the litter bin is without a lid. The cost for replacing the bin would cost in the region of £100 to include installation.</p> <p>After discussion, members felt that the lack of a lid is not considered to be a problem, and agreed to leave the bin as it is.</p>
